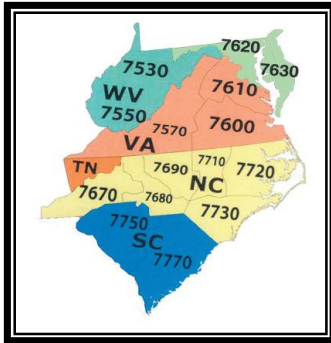

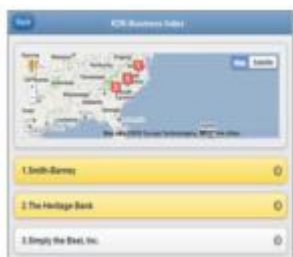

The long awaited Rotarian-to-Rotarian on-line advertising module is now available on the District and Club Data Base to the DISTRICTS IN Zone 33 and elsewhere who want to make this new service available to their Members. The new service is called the **R2R-Business Index** and, is a comprehensive list of businesses owned by members, or businesses employing members wishing to advertise their products or services to other members. The goal of the **R2R-Business Index** is to provide detailed, searchable information about these businesses, products and services, so that other members can reach out to them in an **R2R** scenario.
